The Adriatic Bellflower is a delightful plant that becomes covered in star shaped, violet blue flowers during the summer months. It's easy to grow and requires little maintenance, making it a wonderful choice for the novice or time short gardener. Often used in flower arrangements, it also looks fabulous in flowerbeds or for underplanting. *Campanula garganica* is a great plant to grow in the UK, as it's a tough little number, well suited to frosts and driving winds and rain. Plant in full sun or partial shade for the best results.
