This description is for *Agave neomexicana* (*Agave parryi*):

Parry's agave: this is the agave belonging to Parry, It's leaves are spiny so it's hard to carry

Agave parryi or Parry's agave is a succulent plant growing in a rosette shape about two feet in diameter. The wide thick leaves are a grey green colour, with a spiny dark tip and a toothed edge. This plant is drought tolerant and slow growing making it a low maintenance plant. Because of this it's a popular garden plant for desert areas. At the end of its life it will put forth yellow flowers on a stem that can be up to twelve feet in height. Be careful not to over water this agave as it will rot if it gets too wet.
