This description is for **Aizoon Yarrow** (*Achillea aizoon*):

Achillea aizoon is a small species native to the Balkan Peninsula. It has ferny leaves with a finely toothed edge, a silvery green colour. It has flat, white daisy shaped flowers with a yellow centre that grow in clusters. It's tolerant of heat, drought and pollution and the flowers last a long time. It will spread easily. Plant in full sun or some shade. Aphids and powdery mildew can be a problem. It's easy to grow as long as it has well-drained soil.
