This description is for *allium* (*Allium stipitatum*):

Allium stipitatum is an allium from Asia. It has a tall straight stem topped with a large round pom pom of pale pink, bright pink or lilac flowers. It's often used in cooking in Iran, usually boiled to give it a milder flavour, or chopped and added to yoghurt. Extracts from this plant have been used in malaria medicines and in anti-dandruff shampoos. Stipitatum means 'with a little stalk' but it doesn't refer to the flower stalk but to the short ovary. It will grow in sun or part shade and is well suited to both borders and containers.
