## American hazelnut - sounds like an ice-cream flavour

*Corylus Americana* is a very hardy deciduous shrub that produces white flowers throughout the spring. Commonly called American hazelnut, *corylus Americana* grows in a range of soil conditions but it is susceptible to drought and so prefers moist substrates. It has a moderate growth rate, and often produces multiple stems instead of a single trunk. If left to its own devices it will grow tall, but it's also ideal for using as a low hedging plant. The leaves are an attractive and vibrant vivid green. Like other varieties of hazelnut, *Corylus Americana* is also extremely fire resistant.
