Pilea depressa

This description is for **Artillery plant (Pilea depressa)**:

A mat-forming deciduous trailing perennial, pilea depressa is a charming option for groundcover, but its impressive vines are ideal for hanging baskets and window boxes too. Commonly known as baby's tears, its foliage comprises small, glossy round leaves growing densely along flexible light green vines. It flowers in summer, producing tiny clusters of minute, white blossoms that grow from the tips of the vines between the final leaf pair. Baby's tears thrives in moist but well-drained soil in partial sunlight, but its tender nature means it is best to pot and grow indoors. Water moderately without getting the soil too wet.
