This description is for species *Baby's breath* (*Gypsophila paniculata*):

Gypsophila paniculata, also called baby's breath, is a hardy perennial. It flowers in summer, producing a plethora of small white blooms on tall stems. These can be cut for flower arranging, or left on the plant throughout the growing season. Baby's breath should be planted in full sun and given well-drained soil if it's not to become a short lived perennial. *G. paniculata* has one long taproot and shouldn't be moved once established as this can kill plants. It can tolerate some dryness, but needs watering through long periods of drought.
