**Barberry (Berberis):**

There are around 500 species of berberis that are commonly used as evergreen and deciduous garden shrubbery. Berberis are thorny plants that come in a range of sizes, often varying in colour, with foliage of green, yellow, pink or even red hues. In addition to their bright foliage, berberis produce flowers that are normally yellow or orange. These blooms can be produced singly or develop in bunches, and often develop into attractive berries later in the year. Berberis are hardy plants that can cope with cold winters, and thrive in most soils apart from waterlogged material.
