Though it lies close to the ground, it's hard to overlook *Campanula betulifolia*, commonly known as birch-leaved bellflower. From the lustrous, ovate and toothed leaves, which are a beautiful dark green colour, to the contrasting white bell-shaped flowers, which may be tinged with pale pink, this is a stunning specimen that adds glitz to a garden. Birch-leaved bellflower likes moist and gritty soils with good drainage and will grow in sunny or partially shaded parts of the garden. A dazzling ornamental choice for a coastal or rock garden, this glamorous plant also looks charming lounging gracefully over the side of a container.
