No prizes for guessing that the Trailing Bellflower is a spreading plant, and it becomes covered in a myriad of star shaped small flowers from summer right through to the autumn. These are a delightful shade of blue or violet and look wonderful in a cottage garden situation. She loves the sun, so plant in a full sunlight or partially shaded location, preferably sheltered from driving wind and rain. However, she is more than hardy enough to cope with the worst of the winter cold. *Campanula poscharskyana* is a great choice for a low maintenance garden as she's easy to cultivate and requires little on-going care.
