Bellflower (*Campanula poscharskyana*):

No prizes for guessing that the Trailing Bellflower is a spreading plant, and it becomes covered in a myriad of star shaped small flowers from summer right through to the autumn. These are a delightful shade of blue or violet and look wonderful in a cottage garden situation. She loves the sun, so plant in a full sunlight or partially shaded location, preferably sheltered from driving wind and rain. However, she is more than hardy enough to cope with the worst of the winter cold.

Campanula poscharskyana is a great choice for a low maintenance garden as she's easy to cultivate and requires little on-going care.
