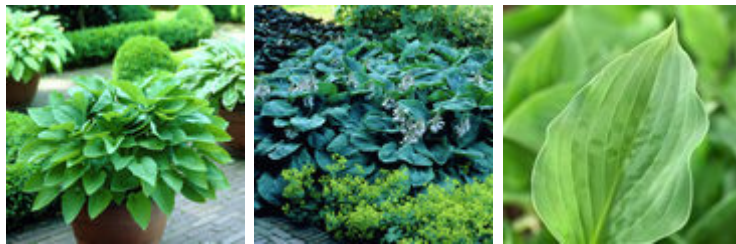


Blue hosta

Hosta sieboldiana Also known as: **Plantain lily, Giant blue hosta, Hosta**

This description is for **Blue hosta (Hosta sieboldiana)**:

This giant blue hosta has monster sized leaves. Only grow it in a big garden!

Hosta sieboldiana has large grey-green leaves, heart shaped with a wrinkled texture sometimes with creamy white edges. In summer light purple flowers can be seen. It grows best in partial shade, with moist but well-drained soil. It grows to around 60cm tall and 90cm across. It's an easy plant to grow, great for beginners. However slugs and snails love these plants so watch out for them or they'll eat the leaves. It's not usually affected by disease. Prune the dead foliage at the end of the growing season.
