The blue passion flower or *Passiflora caerulea* is a climber with breathtakingly beautiful blue, purple and white flowers. This climber has dark green foliage and the leaves have five to seven elongated lobes. This is a quick-growing climber that produces orange fruit during autumn and winter. The blue passion flower thrives in areas of full sunlight or partial shade and grows best in moist soil that has good drainage. This plant accommodates most soil types but it will require protection during winter in cold areas. The blue passion flower is an ideal way to add a touch of exotic glamour to areas such as courtyard or city gardens and can be used with trellises as well. This plant can also be grown in containers and placed on patios or indoors.
