The Buxus is the genus of around 70 different species of plants, and is also referred to as simply Box. It's a slow growing, evergreen plant that flowers with tiny, yellowish-green blooms during the springtime. Often grown as hedges and shaped for topiary, it's also used for its wood. This is commonly used to make chess pieces and some stringed instruments. It's a hardy plant, coping well with the inclement British weather, and will grow in virtually any location as long as it has a bit of shade.
