Echeveria secunda var. *glauca*, or as its also known, Glaucous Echeveria, is a succulent plant that exudes the exotic! Its leaves form silvery-grey rosettes, and in the summer time long stems erupt with yellow and red flowers; it truly is a beauty. Despite its looks, it's relatively simple to grow, and has been bred to cope with the inclement British climate. This means that it will happily live in a sheltered position in the garden most of the year round, but will need protection or bringing indoors during the very coldest months of the year.
