Netleaf Barberry is a gorgeous plant that sports delicate, pale yellow flowers during the springtime. Come the autumn time it becomes decked with small red berries, and the foliage turns from green through to shades of yellow and red – a wonderful sight, and a fabulous way of adding late season colour. It will thrive in either a full sunlight or partially shaded position, and is easy to grow, making it a good choice for the novice gardener. *Berberis dictyophylla* is also very low maintenance, requiring little care throughout the year, so ideal for those who don't have hours to spend tending the garden.
