With oval leaves and oval petals, phlox adsurgens is a great option for cricket fans.

Phlox adsurgens is a creeping perennial commonly known as northern phlox. This plant has dark green, oval-shaped leaves and produces pretty pink and white flowers with oval petals. Northern phlox should be planted in areas of full sunlight or partial shade. It is best suited to loamy, sandy or chalky soil that offers good drainage. The creeping nature of northern phlox makes it a good choice for ground cover but it also looks stunning within flower beds and borders or used as edging or underplanting. Northern phlox is a striking means of adding colour to low-maintenance garden designs and looks great in cottage and rock gardens as well.
