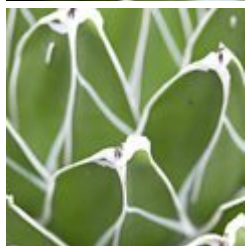


Royal agave

Royal agave: usually not amused.

Agave victoriae-reginae or Queen Victoria agave is a stunning agave with huge ornamental appeal. The leaves grow in tightly packed rosettes giving the plant a domed or almost spherical shape. The leaves are a dark green, short and thick with white edges giving a geometric effect. It's a small agave, growing to just half a metre in diameter. It's one of the more cold tolerant agaves too, but will still need to be in a heated environment over winter in colder climates. This agave has been given an RHS Award of Garden Merit.
