Growing Umbrella Bamboo, or *Fargesia murielae*, can certainly provide your garden with that tropical feel, plus its yellow-green canes and arching bright green leaves make for an eye catching statement. It enjoys either a full sunlight or partially shaded position, but can cope with the worst of the British weather. Often used in locations such as roof terraces (planted in containers), or as hedging and screens.
